<p>We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.</p> <p>As a player, you have a big part to play. That's why The FA is asking every player to follow a <b>Respect Code of Conduct</b>.</p> <p><b>When playing football, I will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Always play to the best of my ability</li> <li>• Play fairly – I won't cheat, complain or waste time</li> <li>• Respect my team-mates, the other team, the referee or my coach/manager</li> <li>• Play by the rules, as directed by the referee</li> <li>• Shake hands with the other team and referee at the end of the game</li> <li>• Listen and respond to what my coach/team manager tells me</li> <li>• Talk to someone I trust or the club welfare officer if I'm unhappy about anything at my club.</li> </ul> <p><b>I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA or The FA.</b></p> <p><b>I may:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be required to apologise to my team-mates, the other team, referee or team manager</li> <li>• Receive a formal warning from the coach or the club committee <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be dropped or substituted</li> <li>• Be suspended from training</li> <li>• Be required to leave the club.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><b>In addition:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• My club, County FA or The FA may make my parent or carer aware of any infringements of the Code of Conduct</li> <li>• The FA/County FA could impose a fine and suspension against my club.</li> </ul>	<p>We all have a responsibility to promote high standards of behaviour in the game.</p> <p>This club is supporting The FA's Respect programme to ensure football can be enjoyed in a safe, positive environment.</p> <p>Remember children's football is a time for them to develop their technical, physical, tactical and social skills.</p> <p>Winning isn't everything.</p> <p>Play your part and observe The FA's <b>Respect Code of Conduct</b> for players at all times.</p> <p><b>I will:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Remember that children play for FUN</li> <li>• Applaud effort and good play as well as success</li> <li>• Always respect the match officials' decisions</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Remain outside the field of play and within the Designated Spectators' Area (where provided)</li> <li>• Let the coach do their job and not confuse the players by telling them what to do</li> <li>• Encourage the players to respect the opposition, referee and match officials <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Avoid criticising a player for making a mistake – mistakes are part of learning</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behaviour.</li> </ul> <p><b>I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA or The FA.</b></p> <p><b>I may:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official</li> <li>• Be required to meet with the club, league or CFA Welfare Officer <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be required to meet with the club committee</li> <li>• Be obliged to undertake an FA education course</li> <li>• Be obliged to leave the match venue by the club</li> <li>• Be requested by the club not to attend future games</li> <li>• Be suspended or have my club membership removed</li> <li>• Be required to leave the club along with any dependents.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><b>In addition:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club</li> </ul>

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## CLUB RULES - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### PARENT/PLAYER – please keep this page for your records

By signing this consent form you agree to, and understand the following:

- Registration Fees are payable on registration - £70 (U7 and non-league U8), £90 (U8 – U16), £25 (U18), cash or cheque to 'Kings Hill Colts'; Under 6s will pay £2 per week to be paid to the Team Manager.
- The player cannot be signed to another Club in the same League.
- There is a Club Ethos and Streaming Policy which all teams adhere to. This can be found on the Club website.
- Managers/Coaches are only responsible for children whilst they remain on the designated site.
- All children must be brought and collected by an appropriate adult, unless specific written consent from the parent/guardian has been received by the Club.
- Children who have been brought to the site must not leave until collected by an authorised adult.
- Although every care will be taken, site exits are not secured and Managers/Coaches cannot be responsible for children who leave the site without first notifying them.
- Please accept that no player has an automatic right to play the position he/she wants.
- All Kings Hill F.C. participants including Parents/Guardians/Spectators will be required to adhere to the Kings Hill F.C. code of conduct guidelines and any participant behaving unacceptably will receive a formal warning. Any participant receiving more than two such warnings will be excluded from attending any further activities for a period decided by the Executive Committee.
- Unacceptable behaviour includes, but is not limited to, swearing, smoking, deliberately endangering others and disrupting activity sessions, but also includes behaviour that the Club feels is inappropriate and/or affects the enjoyment of the Club by other children.
- Parents, players, spectators, children, coaches, managers and any other official of Kings Hill F.C. must adhere to the FA Respect campaign. Those not adhering could face disciplinary action as outlined on page 3 of the Club registration form.
- Shin pads must be worn for all training sessions and matches. Each player will provide their own shin pads and football boots.
- Any player issued with team kit, will be held responsible for any damage caused. Should a player leave the Club, the kit (unless paid for by the player themselves) must be returned to the team manager as it remains the property of Kings Hill F.C.
- Any child regularly not attending training or matches, for no apparent good reason, could lose their place within the Club. It is up to a Manager/Coach to decide what is reasonable. However, any decision to remove a child from their team will be first discussed with the child's parent(s) and second, be approved by the Executive Committee.
- In the event of any dispute between a parent, player, coach or manager, all parties should in the first instance seek to resolve the issue/concern privately via a face to face meeting. If an agreement cannot be reached then the party with the grievance should refer the matter to the Executive Committee.
- The Executive Committee's decisions will be viewed as final.
- **CHILDREN WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN CLUB ACTIVITIES WITHOUT THIS FORM BEING COMPLETED AND HANDED IN TO THE TEAM MANGER WHO MUST PASS IT ON TO THE CLUB SECRETARY. For League Teams, a player cannot play unless the relevant paperwork has been sanctioned by the League Secretary.**

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
